Curry continues under medical care; doctors approve some July travel

Throughout the month of June, Presiding Bishop Michael Curry received further testing and monitoring following a Memorial Day weekend hospitalization for internal bleeding and heart arrhythmia.

Under the care of a cardiologist and an endocrinologist, Bishop Curry has followed orders to rest, and his medical team continues to closely monitor and treat his atrial fibrillation as well as an aortic aneurysm discovered June 16 during a transesophageal echocardiogram with cardioversion. His doctors are also conducting a variety of tests to diagnose and treat the cause of the original internal bleed.

While Bishop Curry will continue to work from home in July on a reduced schedule, his doctors have approved some travel. He plans to be present at Episcopal Youth Event (July 4-8 in College Park, Md.) and the It's All About Love festival (July 9-12 in Baltimore) — solely to preach at and participate in the opening services. He will continue to rest and engage in medical care during his usual August vacation.

Bishop Curry offered the following statement: "I want you to know I am mindful of the power of prayer in tandem with good medical care, and I am blessed to be receiving both. I love what I do and cannot wait to be back actively serving our Lord and the church. I also know that the God who gave us a soul also gave us a body and a mind, and as we are to care for our souls, so we are to care for our bodies. I am in a season where I am called to be mindful about the care of my body. In that spirit, though, I

am looking forward to attending Episcopal Youth Event and It's All About Love, even at a more limited level, as a kind of Christmas in July since much of this is like Advent—a time of waiting on test results and considering various treatments. Thank you so much for all your prayers, and please know I am also praying for you."



Notes from Vestry Meeting on June 11, 2023

Breakthrough Club

Deacon Barbara Gibson reported that more than 30 guests attended the opening, including Sen. Carolyn McGinn who included the event in her newsletter. President and CFO of Prairie View and clients attended. Also CEO of United Way and representative of Central Kansas Community Foundation attended. The club will hire a full time executive director who will receive training in Hutchinson and out of state. Wendy Nugent interviewed Robert and the club is off to a great start.

Outreach items

St. Matthew's will continue to work with Northridge Elementary School by supporting needs of students. Buildings and Grounds

Bryan's Heating & Air Conditioning installed new AC unit in rector's office. Bryan H & AC serviced the outside unit. Estimate from Bryan H & C for new outside unit is \$36-40,000 with a 40-week lead-time to order. We will get more estimates. Chris suggested using the \$40K figure as we plan how to get money for the project. She will develop a maintenance log to track when and who has serviced units.

Members also discussed who will collect mail from the post office.

New Business

The Vestry approved new by-laws to allow a vestry member to serve two consecutive terms. The congregation will vote on the changed by-laws at a special meeting.

An issue with the church phone line and number seems to be resolved.

Other topics discussed by Vestry included kitchen cleanliness, record-keeping of customaries, St. Matthew's relationship with the Payee Program and distribution of The Messenger.

The meeting was adjourned at 1:23 p.m. Mary Anne McCloud, acting clerk

Fun and Interesting Facts about the Episcopal Church

A seal for the Diocese of Kansas first was created in 1897 and has seen a few revisions since then. This version was created in 2004.



It is placed in a "vesica piscis," or pointed oval, conventionally representing a fish. The name of

the diocese and its founding date of 1859 are placed in the upper half of the border. The bottom portion contains the motto of the diocese: In Cruce Solum Nobis Ancora, Latin for "The cross alone is our anchor."

Reflecting the motto, the center features a large anchor cross, flanked by the Greek letters alpha and omega. The Bible calls Jesus Christ the alpha and omega, meaning the first and the last.

Above is a mitre, the ceremonial hat worn only by bishops, to indicate that the diocese is an episcopal church.


We have three openings for the Sunday Altar Flowers on the following dates:
