

## From the Interim Pastor—Fr. Richard Osborne

When we lived in Winfield, Kansas there was a concert every Friday night, during the summer months. It was put on by local musicians at the now closed St. John's College campus. People would bring their lawn chairs and blankets and something to drink. It was a well-attended community event.

One Friday evening at the concert one of our neighbors and her little granddaughter were enjoying it together. The child was completely captivated by this, her first orchestra concert. She sat transfixed through each number, and then, forgetful of her surroundings, she moved a bit closer each time the music stopped. With Grandma following each time she moved, at last she was as close as she could get. She stood within three feet of the first violinist, lost in the sights and sounds of the many instruments.


The concert ended, and for a brief, anxious moment the child realized how far she'd wandered. Then she turned to see her grandmother standing behind her. With a smile of relief, she cried, "Oh, I knew that I could depend on you Grandma!"

It's good to be sought after when we stray. It's great to be cared for when we forget. How fortunate we are that the Good Shepherd follows us more faithfully than we follow him. Like sheep, we nibble ourselves lost, wandering in trivia and minor distractions. Or, we run our panic-stricken ways into the wilderness because faith fails us and our fears take over.

God never leaves us alone, not even for a moment. He never allows us to lose ourselves, no matter how hard we try. Even when we feel most isolated, we are never forsaken. God's silences don't signal abandonment. He is always with us.

It isn't flattering to be likened to sheep; the one thing they do well is bleat. But their bleating, as simple as it is, is their call for help. It's humbling to cry out our dependence, but it is wonderful to be able to say.

"Father, I knew I could depend on you!"

All Saints' Day is as a Principal Feast of the Church, "taking precedence over any other day or observance" (BCP, 15). The day is set aside to remember and commend the saints of God, especially those who are not recognized at other points in the church year.

According to Holy Women, Holy Men, in the tenth century, it became customary to recognize on a single day "that vast body of the faithful who, though no less members of the company of the redeemed, are unknown in the wider fellowship of the Church" (Holy Women, Holy Men, 664). Over time, the day became associated with special remembrances of an individual's family and friends.

## House of Bishops adopts statement on accountability

September 25, 2023 Office of Public Affairs

STATEMENT ON THE ACCOUNTABILITY OF BISHOPS FROM THE HOUSE OF BISHOPS OF THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH | SEPTEMBER 22, 2023

We, the House of Bishops of The Episcopal Church, meeting online September 19-22, 2023, wish to express our heartfelt prayers, well-wishes, and love to the Most Reverend Michael B. Curry, Presiding Bishop and Primate of The Episcopal Church, and his family. We fervently pray for his continued healing and restoration to health and wholeness.

Our time together in candid conversation and in fervent prayer has reminded us of how profoundly the love of God in Jesus knits the whole Church together as the Body of Christ, empowers us for service to God's mission, and calls us to accountability one to another. We acknowledge the disappointment, pain, and grief felt across The Episcopal Church, and in any diocese, regarding the issue of moral, ecclesiastical, and pastoral accountability for bishops. The pain is absolutely real and urgent, both in the dioceses specifically affected by recent cases, and in cases where the recent complaints have recalled prior traumas elsewhere.

Jesus said how we relate to those who are most vulnerable is how we relate to him (Matt. 19:14, 25:40). As disciples of Jesus and servants of the people of God, we acknowledge the imperative to exercise our responsibility as bishops justly, faithfully, and after the example of our Savior. Each of us in this House has taken a vow to defend those who have no helper.

In the spirit of accountability and seeking to move closer to Beloved Community, we fully support the calling of the Reverend Barbara Kempf as the Title IV Intake Officer for Bishops. We also acknowledge and affirm the involvement of bishops, clergy, and laity in the disciplinary process for bishops. We are thankful that the Presiding Bishop has called on the Standing Commission on Structure, Governance, Constitution and Canons to review the Title IV disciplinary process, listen to the concerns and hopes of the church, identify what has worked and what needs improvement, and make recommendations to the next General Convention.

We understand that when any bishop breaks the trust placed in us by the church, the Body of Christ suffers. We are called to be wholesome examples to the flock and proclaimers of the Good News of Christ to all the world.


Trusting in the power of the Holy Spirit and the grace of God, we commit to each other and to the whole Church that we will do our part in the work necessary to bring about the authentic changes our church needs "to walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself for us, an offering and sacrifice to God."

#### A COMMITMENT TO THE CHURCH

The way of love in community always calls us to establish holy boundaries and commit to mutual accountability. To this end, we, the bishops of The Episcopal Church, pledge to continue the long-term work of accountability. We understand this work involves canonical, cultural, and relational dimensions.

We pledge to work with each other, with the House of Deputies, and with leaders across the church to protect the vulnerable, respecting the dignity of every human being.

We pledge to hold each other accountable to standards of conduct set by our ordination vows and the Baptismal Covenant, striving, with God's help, to exercise the responsibilities of servant leadership modeled by Jesus.



The 164th Diocesan Convention will gather Friday, October 20 through Saturday, October 21 at Grace Cathedral (701 SW 8th Ave, Topeka, KS). The registration table will open at noon on Friday, October 20 with business starting at 1pm in the Nave.

Convention business, Eucharist, and celebration will reflect this year's theme *Go: See and Be Seen.* In addition to normal business (elections, mission plan, constitution and canonical amendments, etc.) the convention will hear and reflect on Council of Trustees presentations of its ongoing strategic planning work.

This year's convention will also see the return of our ninth bishop, Dean E. Wolfe, his first official visit since Bishop Bascom's consecration. Bishop and Ellen Wolfe will join convention business, Eucharist, and celebration on Friday. Delegates, alternates, clergy and ex officio members of convention should keep an eye out for the Convention Book which is being sent by snail mail this week. It will also be available on this convention website by September 1, 2023.

#### LET'S FILL UP THE ST. MATT'S FOOD PANTRY.






