### Let God Be God

"Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?


...Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin; Yet I tell you, even Solomon and all his glory was not clothed like one of these. Matthew 6:26-29

Perhaps I speak for you, too, when I confess that I tend to waste my energies in regretting the past and worrying about the future. I've lost many present moments in this self-defeating process. Even though I know that there's only one who can cover the past with forgiveness and light the future with promise – and I know that his name is God – I often forget to let him be God. I forget what I've always known: that God takes care of his creatures.

When Jesus draws our attention to the birds and the lilies, he seems to be saying, "Be at peace with God's plan for you. Do only what you're equipped to do, and let God take care of the rest" the birds don't worry about things they can't do – like sowing and reap-

ing. And the lilies aren't bothered by the fact that they can't toil or spin. God feeds them and clothes them and frees them to do what they do best: the birds to sing, the lilies to grow in beauty and fragrance.

My distrust of God is my great burden. He knows this, and so he invites me to rest in his promise, to accept my humanity and rejoice in my dependence on him. He offers me this golden key to each new day: Let God be God.

## **Book of Leviticus**

Third book of the Bible

## Please join us for this intriguing study every Sunday morning at 9:00 am in the Fellowship Hall.

In the Africa Bible Commentary, Rev. Dr. Felix L. Chingota articulates a popular belief about Leviticus: "The instructions answer the question: How should profane and sinful Israel arrange its entire existence around the wondrous Holy One who has come to be in its midst? The answer was critical to Israel's continued existence in the promised land" (p.129).

Rev. Chingota describes the people of Israel as "profane and sinful." However, if Israel were truly profane and sinful, would we not expect the first sacrifices in the book of Leviticus to deal with their depravity? Leviticus does not begin with such offerings; rather, it begins with voluntary offerings, three to be exact (burnt, grain, and wellbeing). Why would Leviticus begin with voluntary offerings if Israel's profane and sinful state were of utmost importance? Leviticus is the third book of Israel's Primary Narrative (Genesis - 2 Kings, minus Ruth). The book of Exodus precedes Leviticus and, I believe, characterizes Israel differently.

When the time came for Israel to build the tabernacle, God's dwelling place, they abundantly gave – as a "freewill offering" – items that were necessary for its construction (cf., Exodus 25:1-9; 35:4-29; 36:2-7).

Israel is not characterized as a profane and sinful people at the end of Exodus; they were characterized by their hearts which prompted them to give freely to God from their own possessions.


Perhaps Leviticus begins with voluntary offerings because Israel had a giving spirit. Perhaps these offerings come first because the focus is on Israel and their abundant giving, not on God. What do you think?

Everyone is encouraged to wear red on Pentecost Sunday, June 8th. Maybe your St. Matthew's shirt?

The color red signifies the "tongues of flame" that appeared among the disciples at Pentecost.

The birthday of the Church is celebrated on Pentecost, which occurs 50 days after Easter. This event marks the day when the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles, empowering them to spread the message of Jesus Christ and establishing the beginning of the Church. Pentecost serves as a reminder of the transformative power of the Holy Spirit and the unity of believers in Christ.

#### <u>Pentecost and Season after Pentecost</u> (<u>Ordinary Time</u>), <u>Year C</u>

We remain Easter people, now with the wind of the Holy Spirit in our sails. Our task for the months ahead in this season of Ordinary Time, which extends to the end of November, is to look at what Jesus so tenaciously taught his disciples and see what is in these teachings for us as we carry out the work we have been given to do. Jesus promised his disciples a helper, an Advocate, who would stand with them making the work possible. This same helper, the Holy Spirit, hovers over us still eager to quench the fire of fear and replace it with the powerful energy of love.



First Sunday after Pentecost—Trinity Sunday

Trinity Sunday is a feast that celebrates "the one and equal glory" of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, "in Trinity of Persons and in Unity of Being". It is celebrated on the first Sunday after Pentecost. Trinity Sunday is a day for the church to celebrate how it understands God and how it lives out that understanding. It is an opportunity for us to wrestle with, to struggle with, to celebrate the meaning of God in our lives and in the life of our faith community.
